Throughout the 2023/2024 academic year, the students at Cherwell College participated in Relationship and Sex Education sessions in the form of discussion groups. These seminar-style sessions provided the students with a space to discuss both controversial and common topics, allowing each individual to share their personal experience, and also learn and discuss the alternative perspectives that existed amongst their peers. The following topics were covered:



- Respectful relationships (characteristics of positive relationships, stereotypes within society, equality vs equity, homophobia and racism).
- Internet safety and harms (how to stay safe online, bullying).
- Online and media (expectations online vs inperson, digital footprint, online dating).
- Families (status and legality of different relationships, roles of parents, manipulation).
- Healthy eating (understanding calories, principles of a healthy meal, characteristics of a poor diet).
- Self-care (Importance of rest, friends, family, effects of isolation, hygiene). Conducting sessions in seminar format provided the opportunity to experience a university-style approach to learning, which aims to challenge students to provide evidence behind their reasoning. Further, the enthusiasm with which the students participated also highlighted their willingness to share their thoughts and experiences, showing a level of maturity in the way that they conducted themselves.


ART CLUB




WINCHESTER **CATHEDRAL**
